

Supplier Diversity Statement

Parsons recognizes the value of engaging a diverse supplier base to maintain a sustainable and competitive supply chain while contributing to local and national economies. We promote and sustain a diverse supplier base, including providing for the equitable treatment of small, small disadvantaged, woman-owned, minority owned, veteran-owned, service-disabled veteran-owned, LGBTQ+-owned, and historically underutilized business zone (HUBZone) small businesses.
